

Scorecards

The following scorecard errors will normally result in disqualification and forfeiture of winnings (for the entire team if a team event):

- Recording a hole's gross score lower than the correct score. Note: if the recorded score is higher than the correct score, the card stands as recorded.
- Entering a course handicap higher than the correct course handicap.

The following scorecard errors may result in forfeiture of winnings:

- Incorrect allocation of handicap strokes among holes played.
- Recording of incorrect net scores.
- Using the wrong individual scores in determining team score.
- Addition errors.

The following scorecard errors will result in neither disqualification or forfeiture:

- Entering a course handicap lower than the actual course handicap.

Maximum Hole Score for Handicap Purposes

After a Handicap Index has been established the maximum score for each hole played is based on the following:

- Par of the hole + 2 strokes + any handicap stroke(s) that the player receives on that hole.
- There is no limit to the number of holes in a round where a net double bogey adjustment may be applied.
- Where a Course Handicap is calculated at more than 54 and a player receives 4 or more strokes on a hole, the maximum hole score is par + 5 for handicap purposes.
